IN THE UNITED STATES, NEARLY 2,500 PEOPLE DIE each year in fires, and nearly 14,000 people are injured. Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms provide early warning of a fire and allow occupants precious time to escape a burning building. Having a working smoke alarm more than doubles your chances of surviving a fire. Take action today to keep your family safe.

If you live in Bandera County, own your home and do not have a smoke detector in your home, you are eligible to get free smoke detectors through this program.

If you rent your home, your landlord is required by law to install a properly operating smoke detector.

You and/or your landlord are responsible for maintaining the smoke detector by replacing the battery (recommended twice per year) in your home.
